

Church In Africa

Gregorian chant is the earliest form of music in the Catholic Church. It is an unaccompanied sacred song in Latin (and occasionally Greek) of the Roman Catholic Church. Gregorian chant developed mainly in western and central Europe during the 9th and 10th centuries, with later additions and reductions.

Music has a way of piercing into the deep parts of our soul, that assists in our expression and response to God and to the church. Singing helps unites us to the Church. The gospel alone unites believers to one another. However, music is a tool that allows us to do so.

The Second Vatican Council boldly proclaimed that the Church's treasury of sacred music is of more value than any other of her artistic contributions.

St. Augustine, the great fifth-century bishop of North Africa, was concerned with the philosophical and mathematical principles integral to enjoying music. His belief, as was common during the time, was that music affected the soul and, thus, could influence and determine the ethics, actions and morals of the people. He said, "Those who sing pray twice." The words of our hymns are prayers, and when we sing them, we add to them a further dimension of honor and praise.


