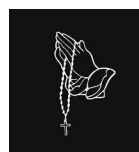

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the section of the Gospel just before these verses, Jesus calls his Twelve Apostles. Now he performs his first exorcism. It is told within the context of conflict with his family.

A crowd so large has gathered that Jesus and his disciples are not even able to eat their bread. His family comes to take him away because they think he is beside himself. And the scribes think he is possessed by the devil. Jesus points out to them the absurdity of their thinking that he uses the devil to cast out demons. In fact, it is Jesus who ties up the strong man, Beelzebub, and overcomes him.

He concludes with a brief saying about the forgiveness of sins. All sin can be forgiven except for blasphemy against the Holy Spirit. It's not known exactly what he means by this. It could be that the only sin that can't be forgiven is the one that cuts you off from the source of forgiveness, the Holy Spirit.

Mark then brings Jesus' family back into the picture. They are not presented in a critical light but are just trying to see him. This gives Jesus the opportunity to point out that family for him is not based on blood.

Décimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

En la sección del Evangelio justo antes de estos versículos, Jesús llama a sus Doce Apóstoles. Ahora realiza su primer exorcismo. Está narrada en el contexto del conflicto con su familia. Se ha reunido una multitud tan grande que Jesús y sus discípulos ni siquiera pueden comer su pan. Su familia viene a llevárselo porque piensan que está fuera de sí. Y los escribas piensan que está poseído por el diablo. Jesús les señala lo absurdo de que piensen que él usa al diablo para expulsar demonios. De hecho, es Jesús quien ata al hombre fuerte, Belcebú, y lo vence.

Concluye con un breve dicho sobre el perdón de los pecados. Todos los pecados pueden ser perdonados, excepto la blasfemia contra el Espíritu Santo. No se sabe exactamente a qué se refiere con esto. Podría ser que el único pecado que no puede ser perdonado es el que te separa de la fuente del perdón, el Espíritu Santo. A continuación, Marcos vuelve a poner en escena a la familia de Jesús. No se presentan bajo una luz crítica, sino que solo están tratando de verlo. Esto le da a Jesús la oportunidad de señalar que la familia para él no se basa en la sangre.

Chủ nhật thứ mười theo Giờ bình thường

Trong phần Tin Mừng ngay trước những câu này, Chúa Giêsu gọi Mười Hai Tông Đồ của Người. Bây giờ anh ta thực hiện phép trừ tà đầu tiên của mình. Nó được kể trong bối cảnh xung đột với gia đình anh ta. Một đám đông quá đông đã tụ tập đến nỗi Chúa Giêsu và các môn đệ của Người thậm chí không thể ăn bánh của họ. Gia đình anh ta đến để đưa anh ta đi vì họ nghĩ rằng anh ta đang ở bên cạnh mình. Và các kinh sư nghĩ rằng anh ta bị quỷ ám. Chúa Giêsu chỉ ra cho họ thấy sự ngớ ngẩn trong suy nghĩ của họ rằng Người sử dụng ma quỷ để xua đuổi ma quỷ. Trên thực tế, chính Chúa Giêsu đã trói buộc người đàn ông mạnh mẽ, Beelzebub, và chiến thắng anh ta.

Ông kết thúc bằng một câu nói ngắn gọn về sự tha thứ tội lỗi. Tất cả tội lỗi có thể được tha thứ ngoại trừ sự báng bổ chống lại Đức Thánh Linh. Không biết chính xác ý của anh ta là gì. Có thể là tội lỗi duy nhất không thể được tha thứ là tội cắt đứt bạn khỏi nguồn tha thứ, Chúa Thánh Thần. Mác sau đó đưa gia đình của Chúa Giêsu trở lại bức tranh. Họ không được trình bày dưới ánh sáng chỉ trích mà chỉ đang cố gắng nhìn thấy anh ta. Điều này cho Chúa Giêsu cơ hội để chỉ ra rằng gia đình đối với Ngài không dựa trên huyết thống.
