Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity

This week we return to the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. This Sunday and next Sunday, however, are designated as solemnities, special days that call our attention to the central mysteries of our faith. Today, on the first Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This feast invites us to consider what we believe about God, who has revealed himself to us in the Trinity, one God in three Persons. The Gospel for this Solemnity is taken from the Gospel of Matthew. In its conclusion, Matthew's Gospel quickly moves from the disciples' discovery of Jesus' empty tomb and Jesus' appearance to Mary Magdalene and the other Mary to the commission that Jesus gives to his disciples in today's Gospel.

The final commission, as this part of Matthew's Gospel is sometimes called, is given on the mountaintop. Throughout Scripture, many of the most important events happen on a mountaintop, and Matthew used this motif often. Peter, James, and John saw Jesus transfigured on the mountaintop, and Jesus taught the crowds from the mountaintop in the Sermon on the Mount.

In today's Gospel, the eleven disciples go the mountaintop in Galilee, as Jesus had instructed them through Mary Magdalene and the other Mary. They see Jesus, and they worship and doubt at the same time. Jesus approaches them and commissions them to baptize and teach. It is a task for which Jesus had previously prepared his disciples; recall that Jesus had already sent the twelve apostles to preach the Kingdom of God and to heal. Yet earlier, the Twelve were sent only to the House of Israel; in this final commission, the eleven are told to go to all nations. The mission of Jesus is now to be taken to all people, and the task is to baptize and to teach.

Jesus commissions his disciples to baptize in the name of the Trinity; this is one of the clearest attestations for Baptism in the name of the Holy Trinity found in Scripture. Other New Testament references to Baptism describe it as being celebrated in the name of Jesus. As we read this Gospel on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded that this central mystery of faith is meant to be lived. As baptized Christians, we share in the life of the blessed Trinity and seek to invite others to share in God's love.

Family Teaching Help on The Trinity

Symbols of the Trinity for younger children

Explaining the Trinity to kids can be hard when we as adults have such a hard time grasping the concept.

If you have younger children, make or find a traditional symbol of the Trinity and place it on your home prayer table. Traditional symbols include trefoil (the shamrock), the pansy, or the Trinitaria, a delicately perfumed white flower with three petals. Or make a triangle surrounded by rays, with an eye looking out from the center. As you make your symbol of the Trinity, talk about the unity of the three persons in one God.

This week is a good time to teach kids as young as two and three years old to say the sign of the cross. Let them attempt to imitate you as you slowly make the motions. You can explain to kids four and up some of the meaning of what they are doing. If you're a bit rusty on the sign of the cross, you can get a refresher in how to make it reverently here:

Solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad

Esta semana volvemos al tiempo litúrgico del Tiempo Ordinario. Este domingo y el próximo domingo, sin embargo, son designados como solemnidades, días especiales que llaman nuestra atención sobre los misterios centrales de nuestra fe. Hoy, el primer domingo después de Pentecostés, celebramos la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad. Esta fiesta nos invita a considerar lo que creemos acerca de Dios, que se nos ha revelado en la Trinidad, un Dios en tres Personas. En su conclusión, el Evangelio de Mateo pasa rápidamente del descubrimiento por parte de los discípulos de la tumba vacía de Jesús y la aparición de Jesús a María Magdalena y la otra María, a la comisión que Jesús da a sus discípulos en el Evangelio de hoy. El encargo final, como a veces se llama a esta parte del Evangelio de Mateo, se da en la cima de la montaña. A lo largo de las Escrituras, muchos de los eventos más importantes suceden en la cima de una montaña, y Mateo usó este motivo a menudo. Pedro, Santiago y Juan vieron a Jesús transfigurado en la cima de la montaña, y Jesús enseñó a las multitudes desde la cima de la montaña en el Sermón del Monte. En el Evangelio de hoy, los once discípulos suben a la cima de la montaña en Galilea, como Jesús les había instruido a través de María Magdalena y la otra María. Ven a Jesús, adoran y dudan al mismo tiempo. Jesús se acerca a ellos y les encarga que bauticen y enseñen. Es una tarea para la que Jesús había preparado previamente a sus discípulos; Recordemos que Jesús ya había enviado a los doce apóstoles a predicar el Reino de Dios y a sanar. Sin embargo, antes, los Doce fueron enviados sólo a la Casa de Israel; En esta comisión final, se les dice a los once que vayan a todas las naciones. La misión de Jesús debe ser llevada ahora a todas las personas, y la tarea es bautizar y enseñar. Jesús encarga a sus discípulos que bautizen en el nombre de la Trinidad; este es uno de los testimonios más claros del Bautismo en el nombre de la Santísima Trinidad que se encuentra en las Escrituras. Otras referencias del Nuevo Testamento al bautismo lo describen como celebrado en el nombre de Jesús. Al leer este Evangelio en la solemnidad de la Santísima Trinidad, se nos recuerda que este misterio central de la fe está destinado a ser vivido. Como cristianos bautizados, compartimos la vida de la Santísima Trinidad y buscamos invitar a otros a compartir el amor de Dios.

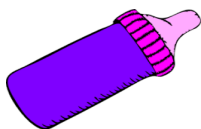
LỄ trọng của Ba Ngôi Chí Thánh

Tuần này chúng ta trở lại với mùa phụng vụ của Giờ Thường Niên. Tuy nhiên, Chúa Nhật này và Chúa Nhật tuần sau được coi là những ngày long trọng, những ngày đặc biệt kêu gọi sự chú ý của chúng ta đến các mầu nhiệm chính của đức tin chúng ta. Hôm nay, vào Chúa Nhật đầu tiên sau Lễ Hiện Xuống, chúng ta cử hành Lễ Trọng Ba Ngôi Chí Thánh. Ngày lễ này mời gọi chúng ta xem xét những gì chúng ta tin về Thiên Chúa, Đấng đã tỏ mình ra cho chúng ta trong Ba Ngôi, một Thiên Chúa trong ba Ngôi vị. Tin Mừng cho Lễ Trọng này được lấy từ Tin Mừng Matthew. Trong phần kết luận, Tin Mừng Mátthêu nhanh chóng chuyển từ việc các môn đệ khám phá ra ngôi mộ trống của Chúa Giêsu và sự xuất hiện của Chúa Giêsu đến Maria Mađalêna và Mẹ Maria khác đến sứ mệnh mà Chúa Giêsu trao cho các môn đệ của Người trong bài Tin Mừng hôm nay.

Nhiệm vụ cuối cùng, như phần này của Tin Mừng Mátthêu đôi khi được gọi, được đưa ra trên đỉnh núi. Xuyên suốt Kinh Thánh, nhiều sự kiện quan trọng nhất xảy ra trên đỉnh núi, và Ma-thi-ơ thường sử dụng mô típ này. Phi-e-rơ, Gia-cơ và Giăng thấy Chúa Giê-xu biến hình trên đỉnh núi, và Chúa Giê-xu đã dạy đám đông từ đỉnh núi trong Bài giảng trên núi. Trong bài Tin Mừng hôm nay, mười một môn đệ lên đỉnh núi ở Galilêa, như Chúa Giêsu đã hướng dẫn họ qua Maria Mađalêna và Mẹ Maria khác.

Họ nhìn thấy Chúa Giêsu, và họ thờ phượng và nghi ngờ cùng một lúc. Chúa Giêsu đến gần họ và ủy thác cho họ rửa tội và giảng dạy. Đó là một nhiệm vụ mà trước đây Chúa Giêsu đã chuẩn bị cho các môn đệ; nhớ lại rằng Chúa Giêsu đã sai mười hai sứ đồ đi rao giảng Nước Thiên Chúa và chữa lành. Tuy nhiên, trước đó, Nhóm Túc Số Mười Hai chỉ được gửi đến Nhà Y Sơ Ra Ên; Trong ủy ban cuối cùng này, mười một người được yêu cầu đi đến tất cả các quốc gia. Sứ mạng của Chúa Giêsu bây giờ là được mang đến cho tất cả mọi người, và nhiệm vụ là rửa tội và giảng dạy.

Chúa Giêsu ủy thác cho các môn đệ rửa tội nhân danh Ba Ngôi; đây là một trong những chứng thực rõ ràng nhất cho Bí tích Rửa tội nhân danh Chúa Ba Ngôi được tìm thấy trong Kinh thánh. Các tài liệu tham khảo Tân Ước khác về Bí tích Rửa tội mô tả nó được cử hành nhân danh Chúa Giêsu. Khi chúng ta đọc Tin Mừng này về Lễ Trọng Ba Ngôi Chí Thánh, chúng ta được nhắc nhở rằng mầu nhiệm trung tâm của đức tin này có nghĩa là phải sống. Là những Kitô hữu đã được rửa tội, chúng ta chia sẻ cuộc sống của Ba Ngôi đầy ơn phúc và tìm cách mời gọi người khác chia sẻ tình yêu của Thiên Chúa.
